**Movie screening and discussion** - The diocesan Office of Justice and Peace is sponsoring a movie screening and discussion 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. **Saturday, March 2** at St Philippe Néri Parish in Vonda, SK. (content suitable for ages 14 years and up.) The film, "**Sexual Revolution: 50 Years Since Humanae Vitae**" examines the parallel developments of the Pill and modern Natural Family Planning (NFP) by telling the little-known story of the founding doctors, respectively, Dr. Gregory Pincus and Drs. John and Evelyn Billings. The film also includes the dramatic life story of Alana Newman, a talented recording artist who was born through donor conception (via an anonymous sperm donor), who goes on an arduous search for truth, beauty, and goodness — and her father. Eventually, Alana discovers the treasures of Theology of the Body, Humanae Vitae, and all the riches of the Catholic Church. The film is endorsed by The Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization. Following the free movie showing, there will be a panel discussion, with local people speaking about their experience of NFP.
