Grow Hope Saskatchewan is back for another year!

Last year over \$550,000 raised for Canadian Foodgrains Bank, thanks to the generous support of Grow Hope participants. This year, generous farmers in the Saskatoon area have again donated land and have agreed to grow a crop in support of this project to feed the hungry. It costs on average \$300 per acre to grow the crop – covering the cost of seed, fuel and other inputs. At the end of the growing season, the farmers will harvest and sell the crop and donate the proceeds to the Foodgrains Bank. They expect to sell the crop for an average of \$500 per acre. The Government of Canada matches these donations up to 4:1, which maximizes donor impact to help bring some of the world's most vulnerable people their daily food.
