

He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners







TUAN DABT Hope

- Interest on debt 2 to 12 times higher
- Inflation and the Covid-19 pandemic increased debt dramatically
- 3.4 billion people live in countries that spend more on debt payments than on health or education





### **PETITION**



- Public, private and multilateral creditors must cancel or reduce debts, and political leaders must support a multilateral framework for debt resolution.
- This would be a transformative shift for billions of people, moving us from a model focused on profit and enriching creditors to one that **prioritizes a just society, centering people and the planet**.





- 1. Stop the debt crisis now by cancelling and remedying unjust and unsustainable debts, without economic policy conditions.
- 2. **Prevent** debt crises from happening again by addressing their root causes, reforming the global financial system to prioritise people and the planet.
- 3. Establish a permanent, transparent, binding and comprehensive debt framework within the United Nations.







In South Kordofan State, Development and Peace — Caritas Canada's support allowed our partner *Trócaire* to provide cash assistance to vulnerable families. Most used the money to buy food, some bought household items and clothes, and others paid for medical services. With Canadian Foodgrains Bank funding arranged by us, Trócaire also provides therapeutic food and treatment to malnourished women and children at 17 health facilities.

#### **Tunisia**

Development and Peace — Caritas Canada's partner, the *Tunisian Economic Observatory* (OTE), analyzes Tunisia's debt and economic policies. It identifies governmental mismanagement and unfair conditions imposed by international creditors. Through workshops and advocacy, OTE empowers citizens to understand complex issues and demand fairer policies and sustainable economic alternatives. This fosters a more just and inclusive approach to the economy that can benefit all Tunisians.











### **Ethiopia**


In a camp for internally displaced persons in Mekelle, Ethiopia, Development and Peace — Caritas Canada's partner, the *Daughters of Charity of Saint Vincent de Paul*, provided food, dignity kits and psychosocial support to 568 women and children. Among them were Ade and her five-year-old daughter, Melati. They had fled the conflict in West Tigray. Ade says **the assistance they received saved their lives**.

Struggling for basic survival, Ade used to not place much importance on education. Now, however, she has come to understand the value of education and childcare services. She hopes that the children in the camp will get to enjoy full-day schooling some day, rather than only the half days they are offered now. That would allow her to find work to support her family.
