Synod on Synodality

Implementing a SYNODAL WAY of Proclaiming Christ and God's Kingdom Today

Synod Implementation in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon was recently launched by Bishop Mark Hagemoen. "Synodality is a process in the Catholic Church described as walking wisely together through mutual listening, dialogue and discernmentto determine God's will for us. And we don't just do that personally, we do that together. It is a way that the Church's members – laity, priests, bishops – everybody – participate in the Church's mission and discern God's will through the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Synodality involves spiritual renewal and structural reform – in other words it affects structures and the way we organize things — with the goal of helping the church be participatory and missionary."
